- The fundamentals of fundraising are still true. When in doubt, go back to the basics.
- Arts nonprofits have a unique power and freedom to advocate for themselves and their community.
- "What happens if we close our doors right now?" The answer should focus on broad impact in the community and at the individual level. The answer to this question is why your organization must fundraise during this pandemic.
- Be authentic about your needs. Have a clear message of what their contributions will support. The more specific, the better. And honor that.
- Demonstrate that you are seeking other avenues of funding as well.
- With everyone feeling a financial strain, grass-roots giving seems to work best. Focus more on many small gifts instead of a few large gifts. It fosters a sense of community and being a apart of something bigger. It becomes infectious.
