

## Tennessee Arts Commission

### TN Nonprofit Arts & Culture Recovery Fund

*2<sup>nd</sup> and final opportunity to apply for this federal pandemic relief funding*

#### PURPOSE

A one-time opportunity for Tennessee arts organizations to address documented negative economic impacts of the pandemic so they may offer arts programs and services in Tennessee communities.

#### Eligibility Requirements Include:

1. Did not Receive Recovery Funds during Round 1
2. Have 501(c)3 Nonprofit or Local Government Status
3. Meet Arts Organization Definition
4. Demonstrate Pandemic-Related Revenue Loss
5. Show Track Record of Federal Grants Administration through TN Arts Commission

5. The **TN Nonprofit Arts & Culture Recovery Fund – Round 2** application opens **November 1, 2022** in the online grants system.
6. To apply for the final round of the Recovery Fund, submit a completed TN Nonprofit Arts & Culture Recovery Fund – Round 2 application by the deadline of **February 3, 2023** in [online grants system](#).
